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A Plunge into the Ocean of Art

Umar's stylus is inspired by love; his sincere love for art and fellow artists. This utterance gives birth to his poetry.

Drawn to the world of surrealist and abstract expressionss art, in which illogical and juxtaposed mages and scenes are deployed to allow the unconscious mind express itself, Unar finds himself, via his poetry, playing the unlikely role of medium and translator between this unique art form and his uninitiated audience. He stands in the gap, as a bridge and mediator, a prophet of sorts, between two different creative worlds, and tries through the magic of language, to unite them as would an art diplomat.

This collection, therefore, is a work of art inspired by other works of art themselves. It is the testament of the love of one artist for the works of other artists; a tribute to their creativity and mission; a discipleship and devotion to their message and purpose.

It is a philosophic grasp at what appears inscrutable, an illumining penetration that pierces through the veil of the mysterious. You feel the honesty of the poet's inspiration in the brilliance of his phrasing, the inexhaustible energy of his lyrical music sweeping through his subjects, his startling and unusual language breaking new frontiers, the childish gusto, playfulness and abandon that are often the hallmarks of bold and unfettered creators.

For who would be so daring as to draw apart the sable curtains draping the enigmatic face of surrealism, and, loving art entirely for art's sake, dare to sing about it without restraint? The passion of Umar's sermons persuades the reader into becoming a convert to his message; they bring the distant names of surrealist artists and their works home to the heart. 
